



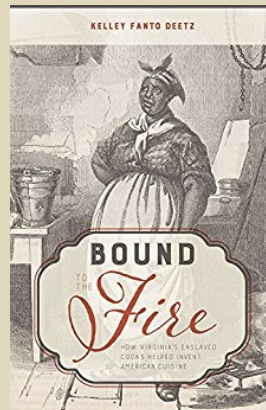

### August Summer Lecture

August 24, 2017, join us for our final summer lecture at Historic Sandusky.

Dr. Kelley Fanto Deetz will be presenting her newest work, *Bound to the Fire*, which gives new insights on how enslaved African American cooks helped to shape common American cuisine. Deetz's work uses archaeology, cook books, plantation records and folklore to show how these men and women were 'bound to the fire' and shaped American history.

This year, Sandusky hosted a summer lecture series. In June, Dr. Clifton W. Potter Jr. professor of history at Lynchburg College, present stories and anecdotes on the Battle of Lynchburg.
